RESOLUTION NO. 14-1055

A RESOLUTION DECLARING IT NECESSARY FOR LEVYING TAX EXCEEDING TEN-MILL LIMITATION, CERTIFYING 5.0 MILLS FOR FIRE PROTECTION AND EMERGENCY SERVICES LEVY QUESTIONS TO THE HAMILTON COUNTY AUDITOR

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Mt. Healthy, Hamilton County, Ohio, met in regular session on the 1st day of April, 2014, at the office of Council Chambers; and

WHEREAS, the amount of taxes which may be raised within the ten-mill limitation will be insufficient to provide an adequate amount for the necessary requirements of the City of Mt. Healthy, Hamilton County, Ohio for fire and emergency medical services purposes; and

WHEREAS, a resolution declaring the necessity of levying a tax for fire protection and emergency medical services purposes under Ohio Revised Code (ORC) Section 5705.19 (I) outside the ten mill-limitation must be passed and certified to the County Auditor of Hamilton County in order to permit the City Council to consider the levy of such a tax and must request the County Auditor certify to the City Council the total current tax valuation of City of Mt. Healthy and the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the tax.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, By the Council of the City of Mt. Healthy, Hamilton County, Ohio, two thirds of all members elected thereto concurring that:

SECTION 1. It is necessary to levy a tax in excess of the ten mil limitation for the benefit of the City of Mt. Healthy for the purpose of providing any of the fire protection and

emergency medical services and equipment as described in Section 5705.19(I) of the Ohio Revised Code at a rate not exceeding 5.0 mills for each dollar of valuation, which amounts to \$.50 for each hundred dollars of valuation, a renewal of an existing tax of 5.0 mills, for a continuing period of time.

SECTION 2. The question of levying such a tax levy shall be submitted to the electors of said City of Mt. Healthy at the special election to be held at the usual voting places within said City of Mt. Healthy on the 5th day of August, 2014.


SECTION 3. That said levy be placed upon the tax list of the current year after the February settlement next succeeding the election, if 50 percent plus one of the electors voting thereon vote to approve this levy.


SECTION 4. That pursuant to ORC Section 5705.03, City Council hereby requests that the County Auditor certify to this Council the total current tax valuation of the City of Mt. Healthy and the dollar amount that will be generated by the proposed levy in Section 1 if approved by the electors.

SECTION 5. That the Clerk of this Council is directed to certify a copy of this Resolution to the County Auditor of Hamilton County, Ohio so that the County Auditor may certify such matters in accordance with ORC Section 5705.03 so that City Council members will be able to consider, pass and timely file the necessary resolution for consideration by electors at the August 5, 2014 election.


SECTION 6. That this Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after the first date provided by law.
